# How to assess animal bites OR concerns about rabies exposure

## Step 1. Treat wound and administer tetanus vaccination, if required.<sup>1</sup>

### **Step 2.** Assess risk for rabies exposure.


- Was patient exposed to mammal's saliva or central nervous system material via:
  - bite through skin?
  - mucous membranes?
  - non-intact skin?
- Did a bat land on or touch the patient?

If answer is **YES** to any one of these, go to **Step 3.**<sup>2</sup>

If answer is **NO** to both scenarios, no further action required.

Exposure to a mammal's blood, urine, feces, or a skunk's spray does not pose a risk of exposure to rabies.

#### **Step 3.** Assess action required.
