CRIMINAL RECORDS CHECK/VULNERABLE SECTOR CHECK

All new hires are required to have both a Criminal Record and Vulnerable Sector Check completed.

This is NSH policy and no exceptions will be made. Your Criminal Record and Vulnerable Sector Checks must to be completed and submitted in order to become an employee.

- ▶ These must be completed and issued within the last six months or your start date. DO NOT delay in applying for this check as police processing could take up to 30 days or more and this could affect the start date of your residency.
- ► An electronic copy is acceptable. An original copy will only be requested if required for verification purposes.
- ► It is your responsibility to pay the cost.

Where can I get a Criminal Record/ Vulnerable Sector Check done?

1. IN PERSON;

At your local RCMP detachment or local Regional Police Station.

- Request both a complete criminal record check and vulnerable sector check.
- Note: Residents living in Toronto area we are not a registered agency with the Toronto police. See CSI information below.

2. BACKCHECK:

If you live within the **Halifax Regional Municipality** (HRM) you can obtain a criminal record check through www.backcheck.net/halifax as this company has partnered with the Halifax Regional Police.

- Request both a complete criminal record check and vulnerable sector check.
- Share your results with Nova Scotia Health Authority Headquarters.

3. CSI BACKGROUND SCREENING:

CSI background screening www.csiscreening.com is a service that can be used by all residents.

- Request both a complete criminal record check and vulnerable sector check (not an "Enhanced Criminal Record Check").
- In order to obtain a vulnerable sector check with CSI, an in person appointment in Halifax is required for fingerprinting.
- Residents living in Toronto CSI has affiliate fingerprinting locations in the area contact CSI directly for more information.
- Share your results with Nova Scotia Health Authority Headquarters.
