Subject:	Changes to Specimen Collection and Processing of Ammonia in the Central Zone

Effective July 8, 2019 Ammonia collection in the Central Zone will change to improve the stability of the specimen.

Specimen collection requirements:

Specimens collected in a 4.0 ml lavender top EDTA tube, filled to capacity, placed on ice and delivered to the laboratory <u>within 20 minutes</u>.

Reference range:

Reference range remains at 18-72 umol/L for all age groups.

Nova Scotia Laboratories processing requirements:

Centrifuge and aliquot plasma within 30 min of collection. Plasma aliquot is stable for 2 hours at 4°C or 3 weeks if frozen.
