24-Hour Urine Catecholamines and 5HIAA and Metanephrine Collection Instructions

If you are taking medication, you should discuss this with your physician.

Diet Restrictions for these Tests:

This diet must be at least 3 days prior to collection and during collection:

- A. Avoid taking vitamin supplements and medication containing catecholamine (consult with physician).
- B. In order to ensure the validity of results, the following foods and drugs must be avoided for three days prior to, and during specimen collection:

Foods to Avoid	Drugs to Avoid
	Alpha-methyldopa
	Isoproterenol
Caffeine	Labetalol
(chocolate, coffee, tea, cola)	Mandelamine
Vanilla	Metoclopramide
Bananas	Acetaminophen
	Cimetidine metabolites

- 1. Only a **24-hour** urine collection is acceptable.
- 2. Follow the 24-hour urine collection procedure.
- 3. The collection containers are jugs that contain 15-20 ml of 6N HCl (acid) to prevent the decomposition of the sample. Keep the container tightly covered so the acid will not leak out prior to the beginning of the collection.
- 4. Be sure to mix the specimen after each urine addition.

Each accompanying **requisition form** must include the following information:

- Your full name and Date of Birth
- Your health card number
- Physicians full name and address
- Start date and time for each urine collection.

Label the collection container with your name, date of collection and start and end time.
