A large polyp greater than 1cm



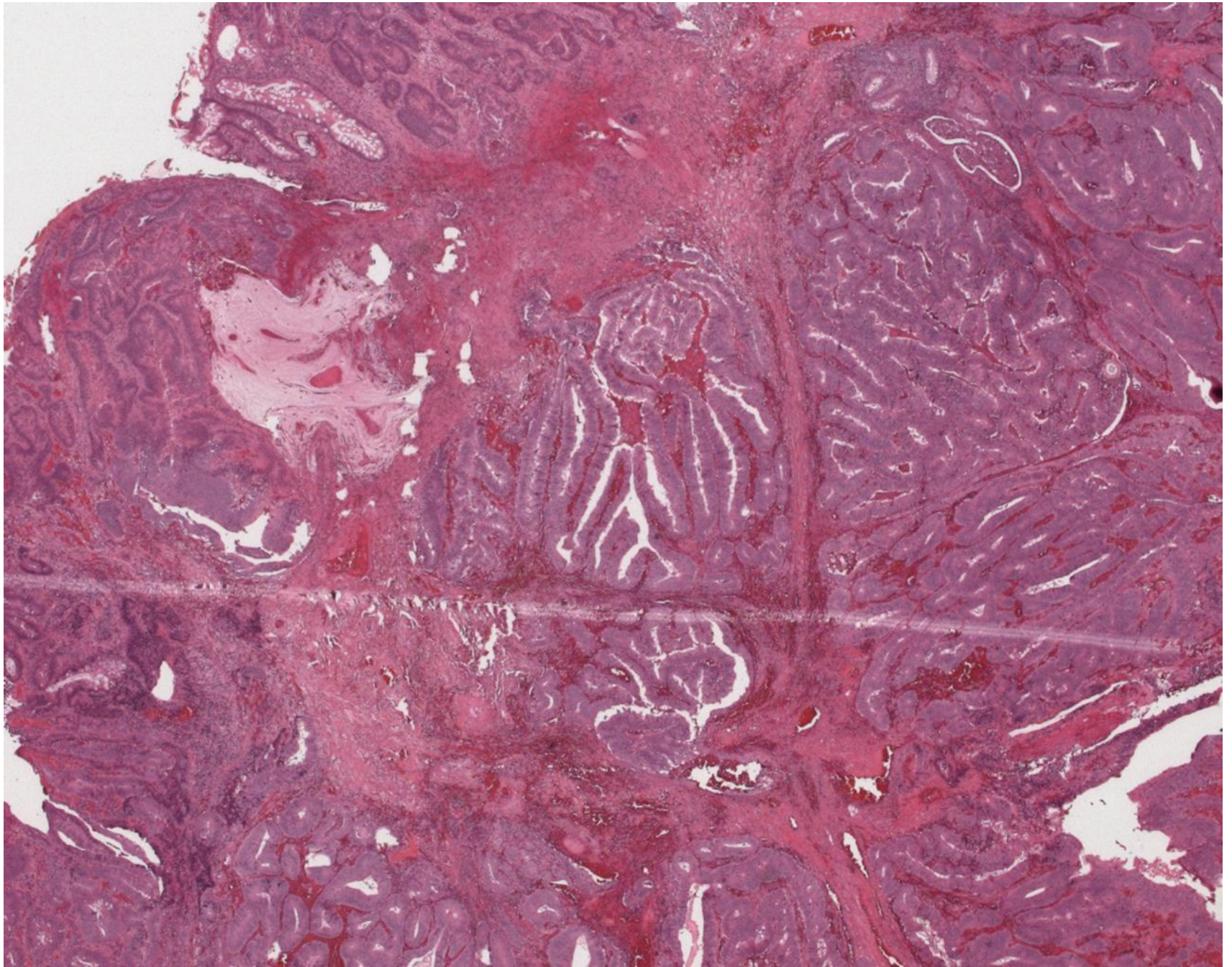


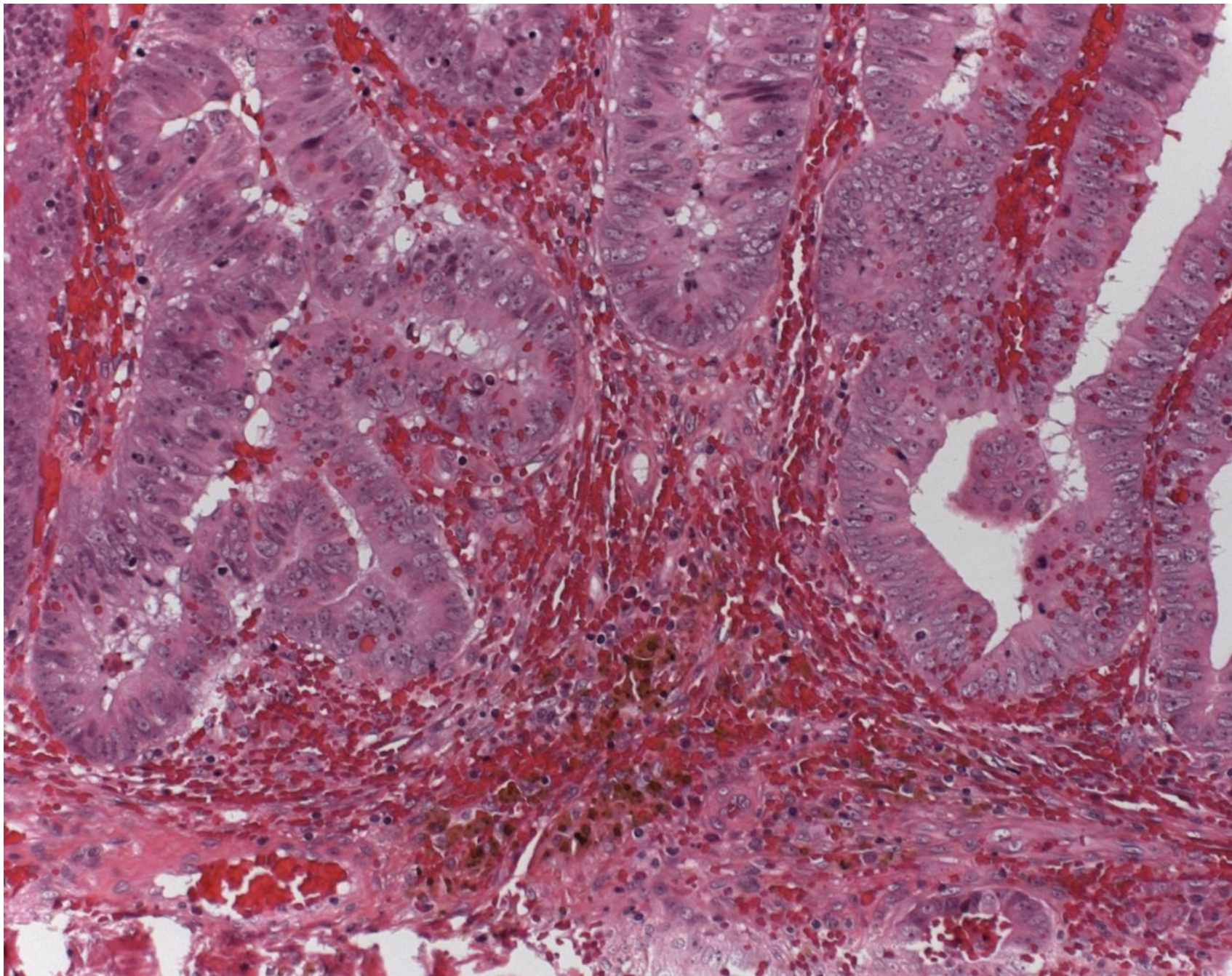

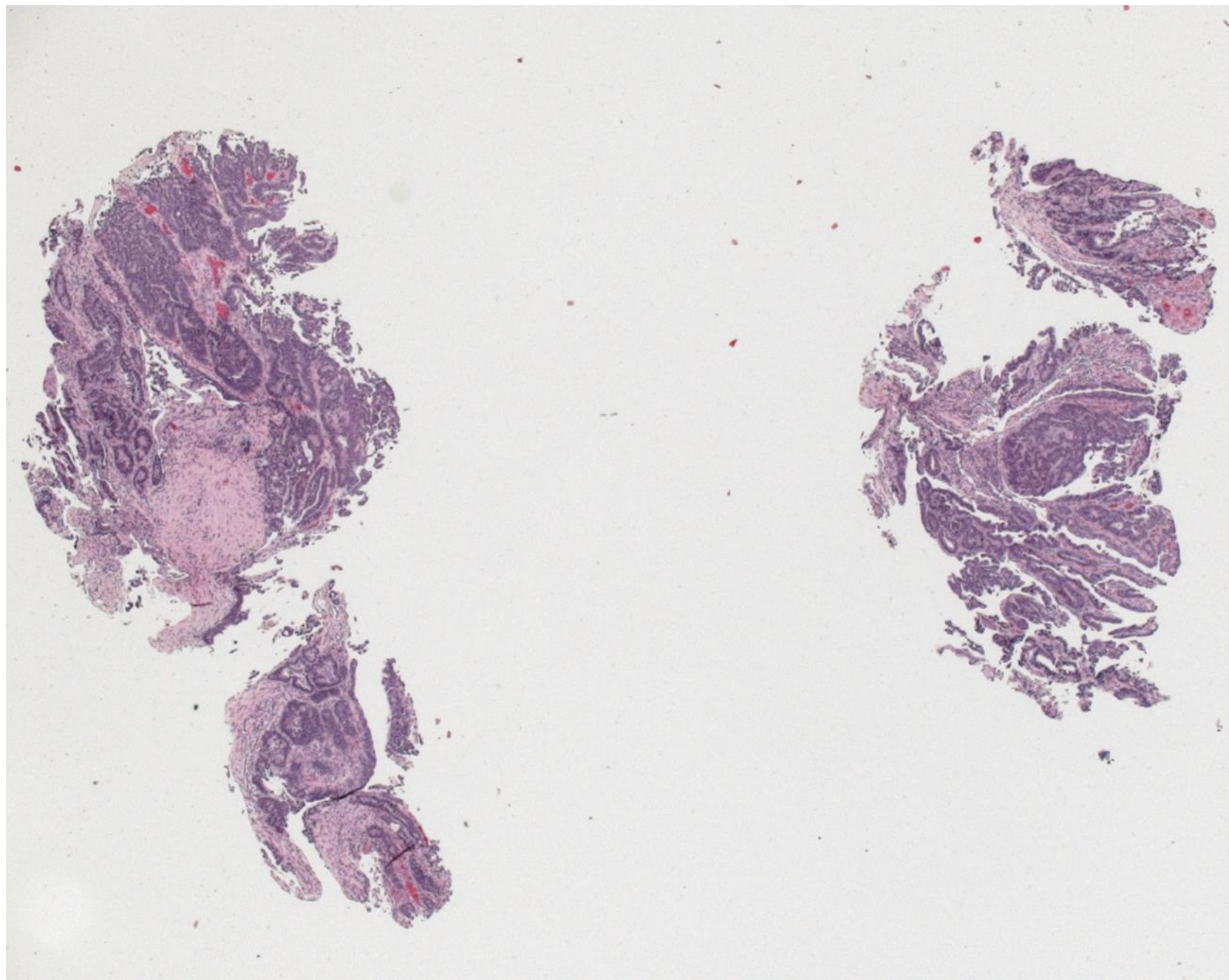


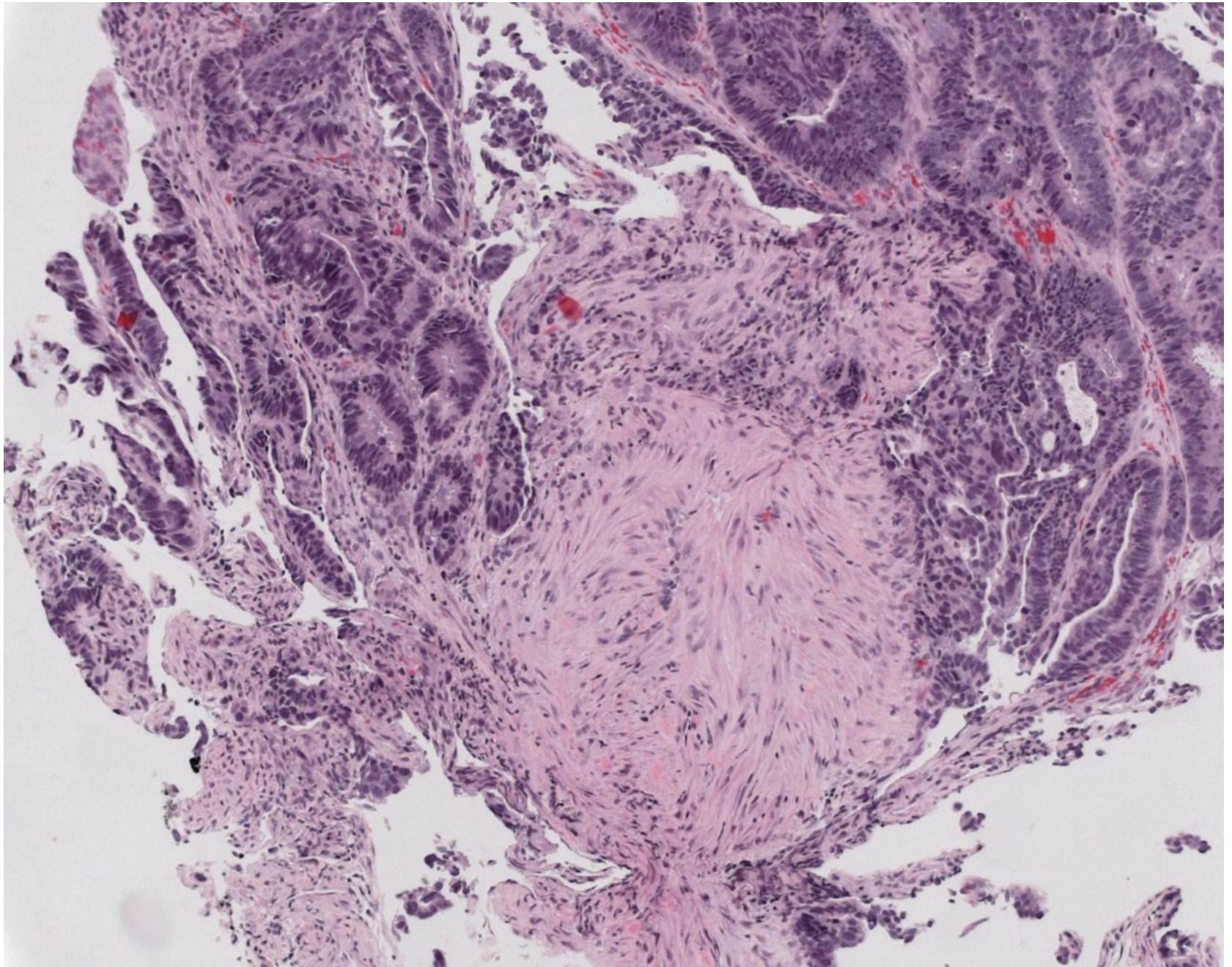


Case 4

- Resection: Negative for dysplasia and malignancy; tattoo inked

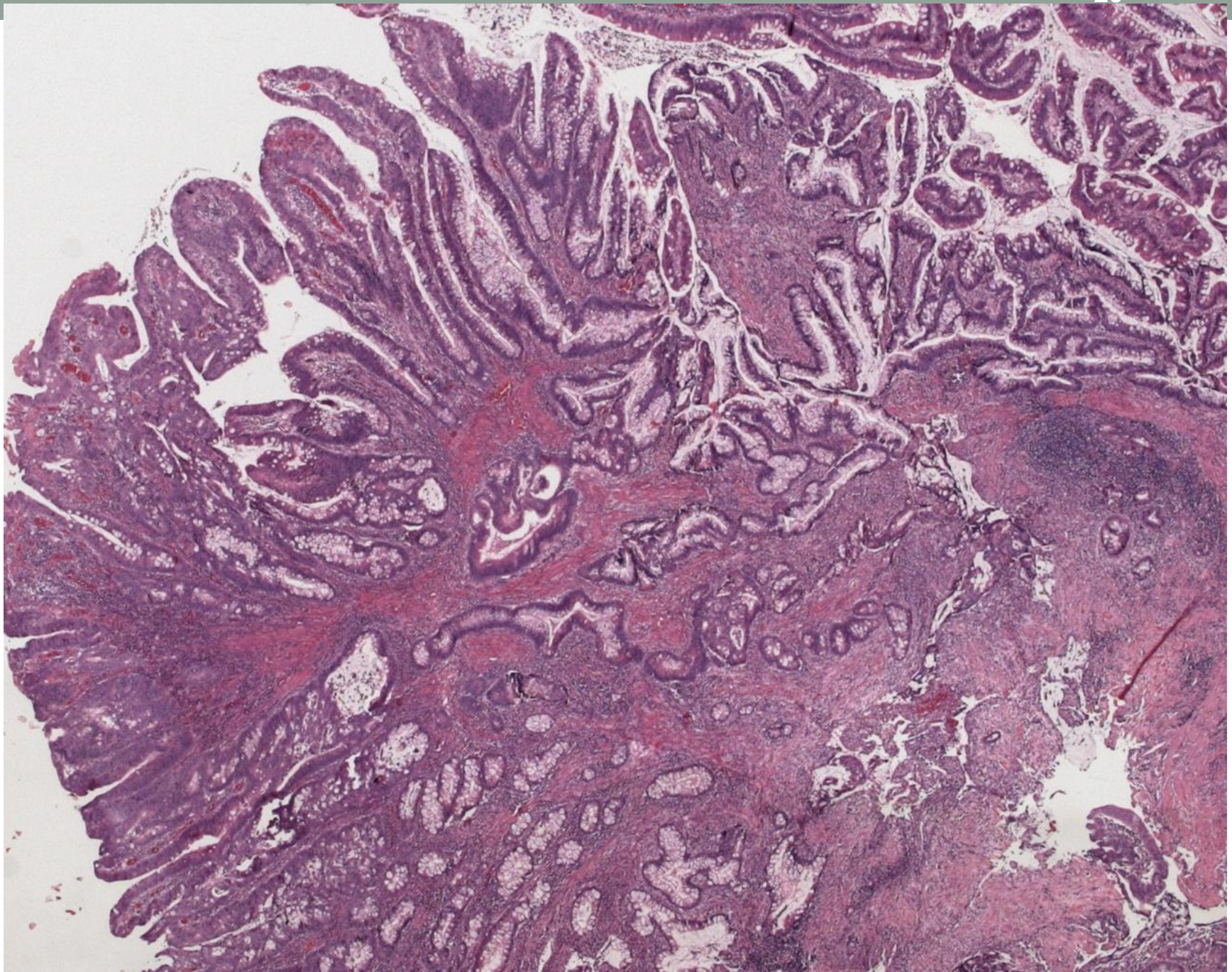


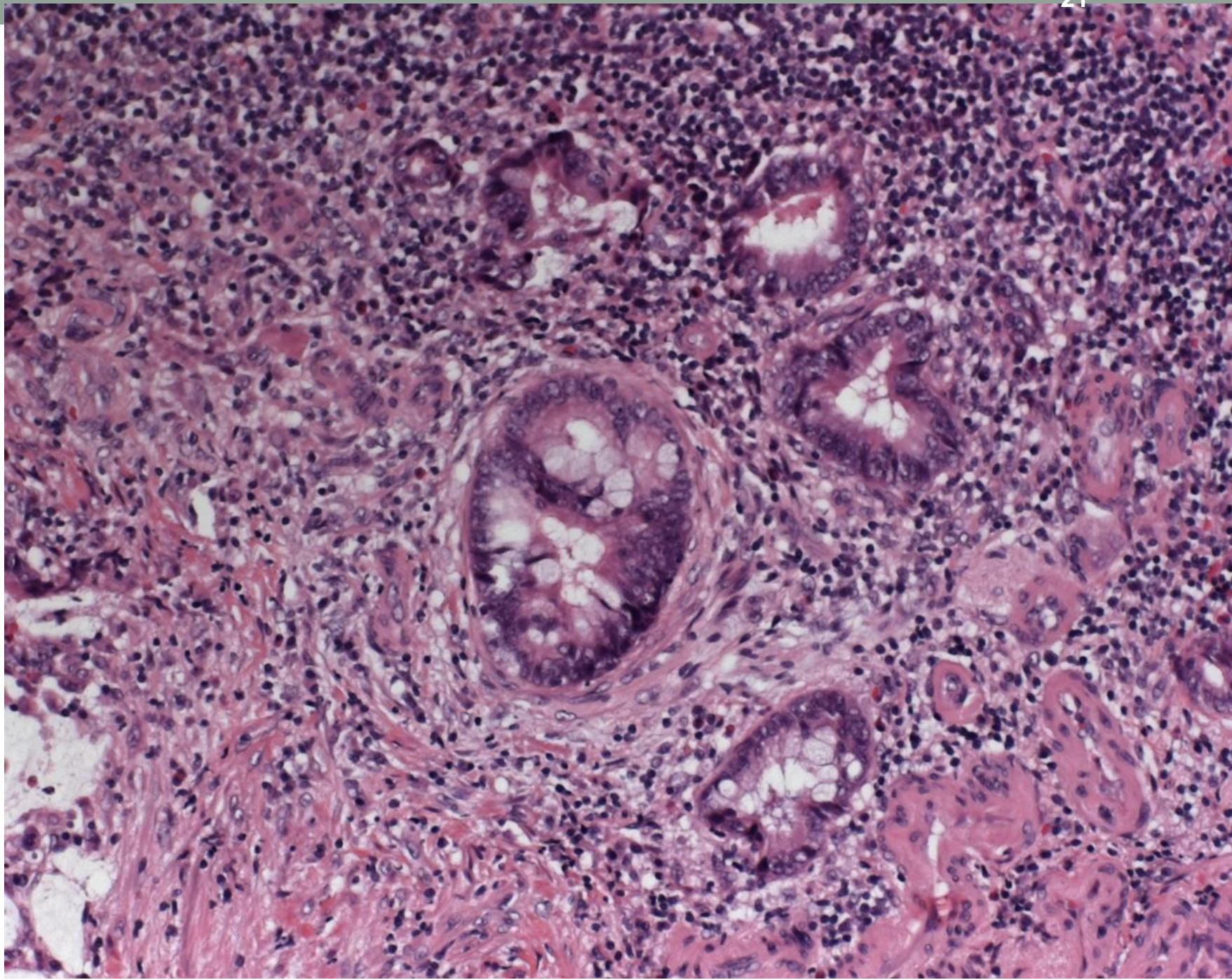


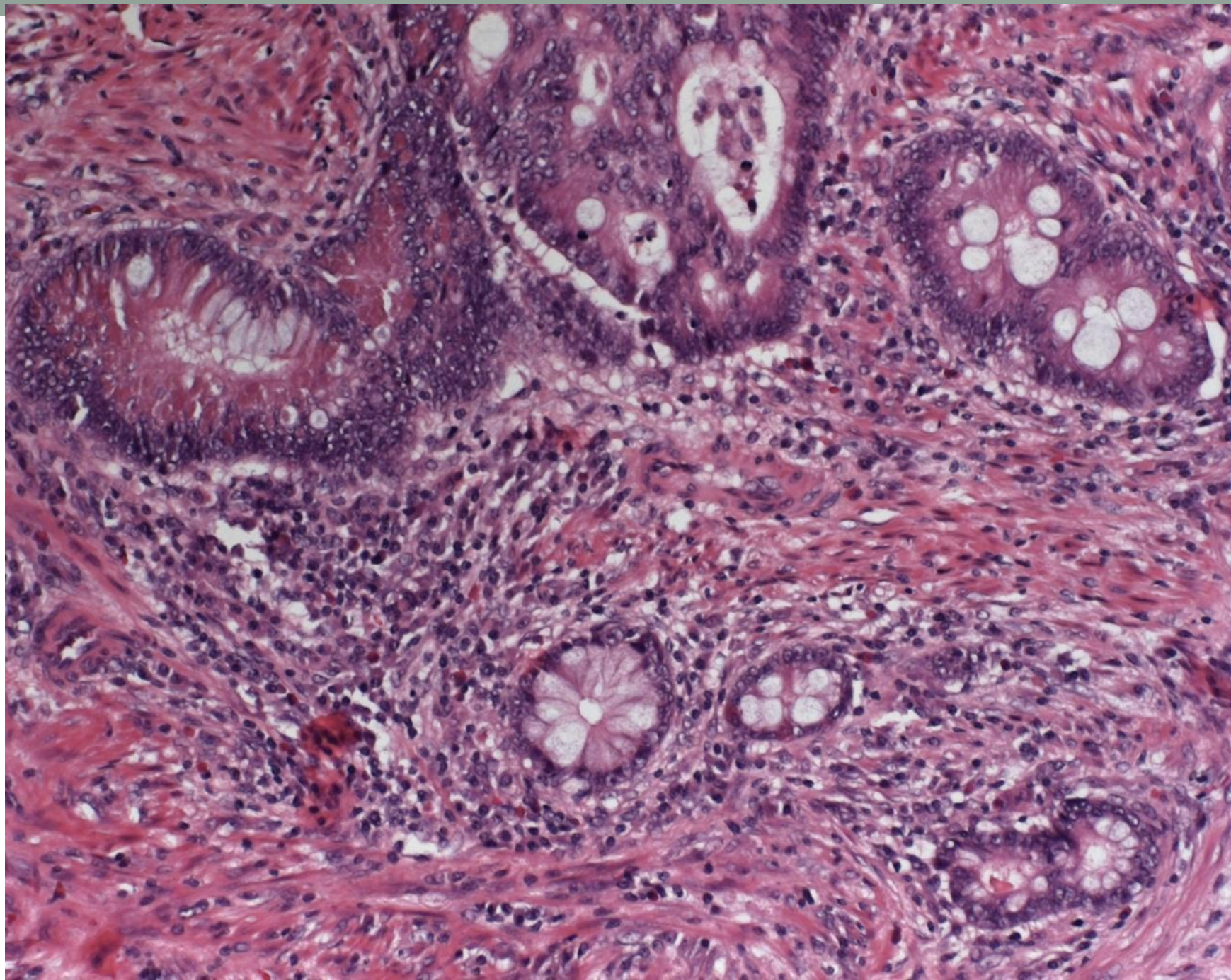


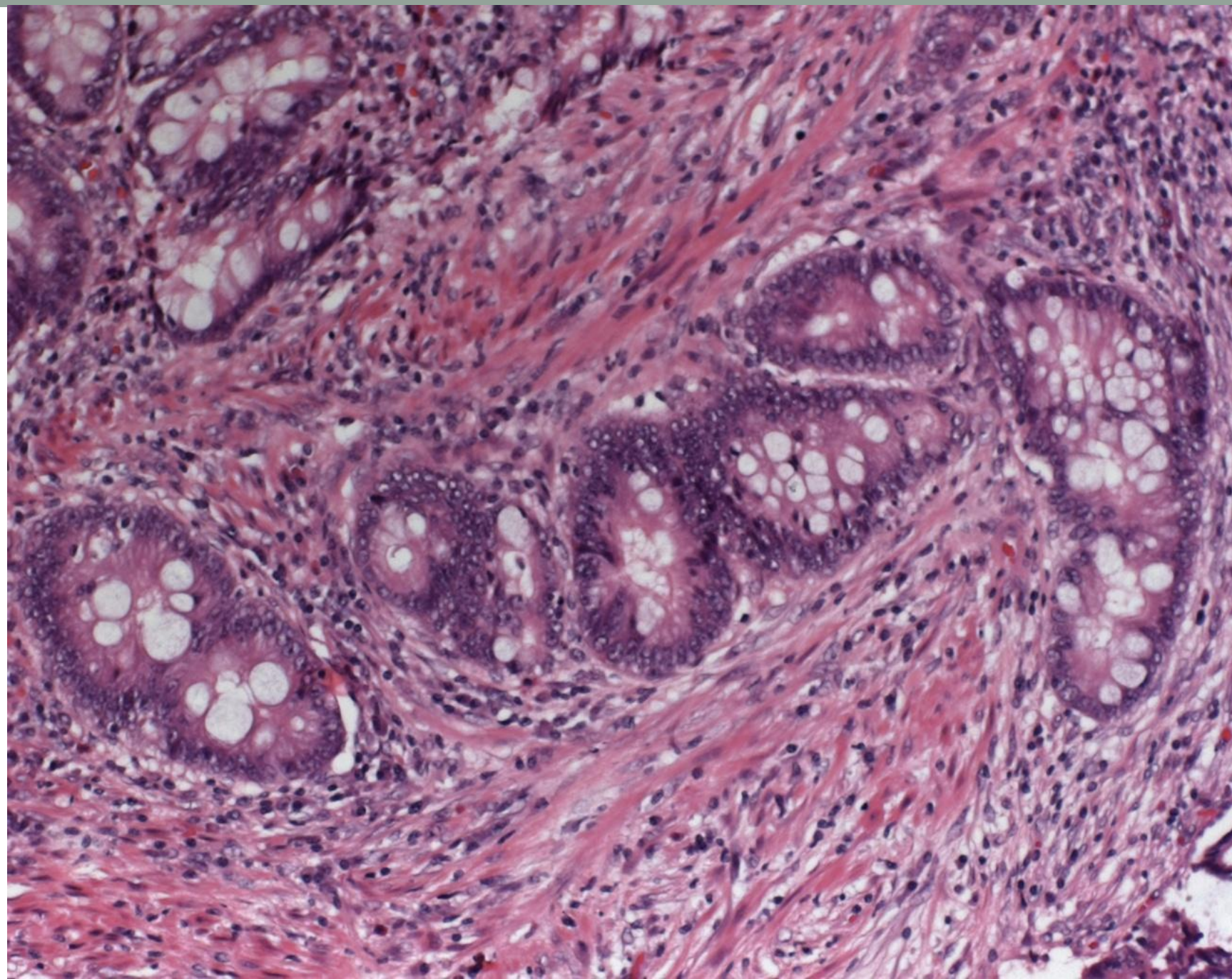
