Dr. Hala Tamin is an Associate Professor at the School of Kinesiology and Health Science at York University and holds an adjunct faculty position in the Department of Community Health and Epidemiology at Dalhousie University. She has a PhD in epidemiology from McGill University, a Masters in Public Health from Emory University and a Bachelor of Science in Public Health from the American University of Beirut. Hala is a member of the LaMarsh Centre for Child and Youth Research at York University and a member of the York University Centre for Aging Research and Education (YU-CARE). She has more than 15 years of professional teaching and training experience. Hala has extensive expertise in research methods and statistical analyses. She has managed several multi-centre projects and has published over 130 peer-reviewed papers. Her main research interests are maternal and child health, evaluation of trauma care and adolescent health risk behaviours.
