The Department of Emergency Medicine at the Queen Elizabeth II Health Sciences Centre (QEII HSC) in Halifax, Nova Scotia, is seeking an EM physician with additional graduate-level research training and a demonstrated or emerging track record in publications, grant capture and/or contract research for the position of Research Director.

The position provides protected academic time. Responsibilities are negotiable, but include:

- Driving strategic research planning
- Representing departmental research interests locally, regionally and nationally
- Championing resident/faculty research development

The QEII HSC is a busy academic teaching hospital with an annual census of ~70,000 patients. The Department of Emergency Medicine supports strong residency programs in both the FRCP and CCFP(EM) streams. Being the only level 1 trauma centre and adult tertiary care centre in the province, the department sees the entire spectrum and severity of illness and injury in a new and innovatively-designed and functioning ED.

You will join an active, collegial and motivated group of approximately 30 EM clinicians, researchers and educators at the QEII HSC with subspecialty expertise ranging from EMS/trauma systems to toxicology research, and airway management, to critical thinking in medical education. The academic department also includes Pediatric EM at the IWK Health Centre and the Saint John campus in New Brunswick (as well as other EDs in the Capital District) allowing for many opportunities for academic collaboration and workload mix.
