
Your 4 moments for HAND HYGIENE



1	BEFORE PATIENT CONTACT		When approaching - clean your hands before touching a patient and/or any equipment, furniture or surface in their bed space To protect the patient against harmful germs carried on your hands
2	BEFORE AN ASEPTIC TASK	When? -	Clean your hands immediately before any aseptic task (and before donning gloves) To protect the patient against harmful germs, including the patients own germs, entering his or her body
3	AFTER BODY FLUID EXPOSURE RISK		Clean your hands immediately after an exposure risk to body fluids (and after glove removal) To protect yourself and the health-care environment from harmful patient germs
4	AFTER PATIENT CONTACT	When? -	When leaving – clean your hands after touching a patient and/or any equipment, furniture or surface in their bed space To protect yourself and the health-care environment from harmful patient germs
