SUBJECT:	Blood Administration Policy CL-BP-030 Revision

The Blood Administration Policy CL-BP-030 has been revised to reflect requirements in the <u>Mandatory Reporting of Serious Adverse Drug Reactions and Medical Device Incidents Policy</u> December 2019 and the <u>Smart Pump Infusion Therapy – Use of Infusion Pump with Dose Error</u> <u>Reduction System (DERS) Policy February</u> 2020. In addition the policy has been revised to address feedback from the Transfusion Medicine AABB Accreditation and now identifies additional information required for transfusion associated overload (TACO) these changes will be implemented March 1st, 2021.

Revisions include:

- A Note box has been added to the policy body (p. 11) stating: If a serious reaction to a Blood Product is suspected, this must additionally be reported in SIMS as per NSHA AD-QR-030, IWK- 339 Mandatory Reporting of Serious Adverse Drug Reactions and Medical Device Incidents (Vanessa's Law).
- Appendix D has been edited to specifically cite that platelets can be given via gravity <u>or</u> may be infused via Fresenius Kabi Agilia© and B Braun pumps.
- Policy statements 4, 5 and 6 have been added:
 - $\circ~$ i) regarding the Authorized Prescriber's (AP) responsibility to assess recipient risk factors for TACO
 - ii) Transfusion service's ability to contact the AP and Medical Director to seek additional information when necessary;





- iii) Transfusion Services responsibility to notify the AP before any blood component is administered outside of appropriate utilization, as defined in the NSHA/IWK Blood Utilization Guidelines.
- An appendix (F) has been added outlining the recipient risk factors for TACO and tactics to reduce circulatory loading.
